

LLOYDTOWN
In 1832 James Lloyd of Ontario who had come from Pennsylvania to Upper Canada about 1812, purchased 500 acres of land in the vicinity. During the following years he sold portions of his property to farming settlers. The erection of a grist mill, sawmill and wooden mill, two tanneries, stores and a number of pioneer industries hastened Lloydtown's growth. By 1850 the community contained about 500 persons. James Lloyd, the founder of the village, had played a significant role in the following Mackenzie rebellion. Lloyd was forced to flee to the United States where he died in exile.
